Schedule a Screening Mammogram*

Mammogram – The gold standard

The best way to detect breast cancer early is through a mammogram. This low-dose X-ray of the breast can detect breast changes before physical symptoms develop. At 87% sensitivity⁴, the mammogram is a good early detection screening that can lessen the need for mastectomy or chemotherapy.

Who's at risk of breast cancer

It's important to know your risk of breast cancer and to understand that risk can change over time. Family history can play an important role in knowing and understanding risk, as can drinking alcohol, smoking, obesity, and taking hormone therapy for symptoms of menopause.

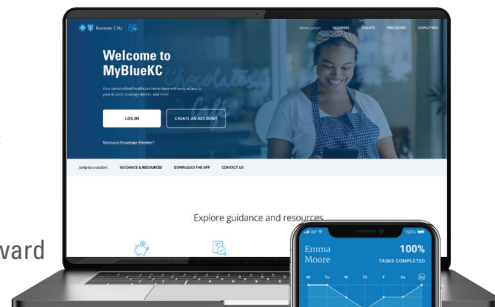
However, you can work toward lowering your risk by:
